It's Cold Outside - Dress Warm

Students will be outside until the windchill factor is above 15 degrees. When the wind chill drops below 15 degrees, we adjust the length of time for recess to last no more than 15 minutes. If the wind chill drops below zero, our students will remain indoors. We encourage you to send your student with boots, snow pants, hats and gloves each day. These items may remain in their locker but are useful all winter season long.

STEM Spot

Collaboration and problem-solving are the names of the games in STEM class. Students are responsible for designing, problem-solving, and constructing projects that serve a purpose. STEM students are thoroughly enjoying the challenges that they are presented with both tactilely and through online explorations into coding and programming.
